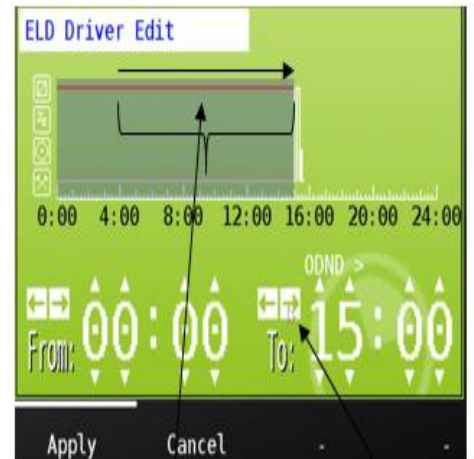

SHORT CUT EDIT



If you touch the right and left arrows next to the clocks it will move the status line in either direction to the next or previous record of duty status.



In the example above by touching the right arrow it moves the duty status line right to the next record of duty status @ 1500. Example above the time has been edited from 03:15 to 15:00 Then press: Apply> Save> Press Here> Type Remark> Save.
